The Board of Directors of the H.W. Wilson Foundation has announced continuation of its support of education in library and information science with a new round of scholarship grants.

For over 50 years H.W. Wilson has supported U.S. and Canadian library and information science patrons accredited by the American Library Association. This is the third year of a four year program which will send \$580,000 over four years to assist qualified students to enter the profession in the U.S. and Canada.
